




Starting October 1, 2022, Bayou State Waste, LLC is proud to be your new service provider for residential garbage collection.

In order to provide excellent service throughout St. Landry Parish, collection days have been revamped.

Collection service will be going from twice a week, to once a week parish wide. Your new collection day will be determined by your location. Individual residents and small commercial businesses utilizing cart service can find their new garbage collection schedule either by calling (337) 290-1456 or at this website www.bayoustate.net. Customer service hours are Monday - Friday 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Each residence will be initially provided with a ninety-six (96) gallon wheeled cart and allowed up to two (2) bags of garbage to be placed outside the cart on pick-up day. Information on obtaining an extra cart or how to purchase one can be found at www.bayoustate.net
